Colonel James Kilbourne, the first  
Master of New England Lodge and one  
of the founders of Worthington, had the  
vision to establish a new settlement  
where the virtues of Freemasonry could  
be practiced. New England Lodge #4  
was chartered in 1803 and has been in  
continual operation since - inspiring,  
educating, and improving men  
throughout our community.

Freemasonry is the world's oldest fraternity, made up of men as young as 19 and as old as 95 or older – in community working together to make themselves and our world a better place – guided by the principles of **Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth.**

Paul A. Weglage, Past Grand Master of Freemasons in Ohio shared in 2023, "Freemasonry is a journey of self-improvement and enlightenment, a journey that has guided countless individuals throughout history towards becoming better men, better citizens, and better stewards of the world around us."

It is a "call to action in our daily lives", as Most Worshipful Brother Weglage explained.
